


DEAR NEIGHBOR,

- 1. Allow for law enforcement to give court appearance SUPPORT OPPOSE
- citations instead of arrests for petty misdemeanors, misdemeanors, and violations, expand pretrial release requirements and allow the court to order substance abuse assessment and treatment prior to trial.
- 2. Update Hawaii's firearms law to prohibit concealed weapons in sensitive places such as schools, medical facilities, public transit, and government buildings.
- 3. Uphold reproductive rights in Hawaii to protect an individual's bodily autonomy and their right to choose when to start a family (Roe v. Wade protections).
- 4. Allow liquor licensees engaged in meal service to sell unopened beer, wine, and prepackaged cocktails with food for pick-up or delivery.
- 5. Legalize recreational use of cannabis (marijuana) for adults.
