



Expand Hawaii's assault weapons ban that currently only applies to pistols to include assault rifles (AR-15s) and shotguns. Note: does not apply to members of law enforcement or the military. (SB3196) a. Only ban 50-caliber sniper rifles and magazines with over 20 rounds and exclude assault rifles and shotguns 2. Prohibit the sale of ammunition to any person under the age of 21 and prohibit any person under the age of 21 to own, possess, or control ammunition. (SB2845) 3. Legalize, regulate, and tax adult recreational cannabis use. (SB3335) 4. Remove the in-person requirement for controlled substance prescriptions, such as testosterone to receive gender-affirming health care services. Protect individuals who receive, seek, provide, or aid and abet the provision of gender-affirming health care services that are lawful in Hawaii from civil or criminal actions under the laws of other jurisdictions. (HB2079) 5. Lapse State funds previously authorized for the planning, design, and construction of a new Aloha stadium in Halawa and redirect funds for a new stadium to be built on the UH Manoa campus. (HB2664) 6. Expand student transportation options for school bus services by allowing the use of smaller vehicles like minibuses, motorcoaches, and vans for DOE schools. (HB1767) 7. Allow homeowners in residential neighborhoods to subdivide their lots into parcels as small as 2,000 sq ft and allow two or more detached or attached residential units (such as ADUs) to be built on each. (HB1630/SB3202) 8. Allow pedestrians to cross a street contrary to the statewide traffic code when a pedestrian carefully and reasonably determines that there is no immediate danger of a collision with a moving vehicle. Rep. La Chica speaks on HB1766, her bill to target the spread of deceptive and fraudulent deepfakes during elections. Deepfakes are any form of manipulated media that misrepresent individuals, often showing them saying or doing things they never did. Deepfakes contribute to political misinformation and erode the public's trust. HB1766 passed out of the House and is awaiting its final hearing with the Senate Judiciary committee.

Rep. La Chica visits her area schools - Kanoelani Elementary, Mililani Uka Elementary, and Mililani Middle School during the 5-day recess to learn about their top priorities and advocate for their needs. The proposed House budget includes over \$11M (FY24) and \$15M (FY25) in capital improvement funding for Mililani-Waipio area schools.





### Concern on Kids' E-Bike Use:

Our office has received complaints about underaged kids speeding on e-bikes throughout various areas in the community. We would like to emphasize to our community members that following HRS §291C-143.5, individuals under the age of 15 should not be riding e-bikes, and violations are subject to a traffic infraction. Concerns can be reported to HPD's nonemergency line: 808-723-8710.

### Overgrown Grass/Trees:

On 1/20, we were alerted to the regrowth of a tree our office previously serviced on the Meheula Parkway median by the Mililani Mauka off ramp, accompanied by tall grass nearby. This posed a hazard to drivers, obstructing visibility. Upon contacting the Department of Transportation (DOT), prompt action was taken to remove the tree and trim the grass on 1/29.

#### Cracked/Uplifted Sidewalk:

On 2/29, a resident reported tripping and falling on a cracked, uplifted sidewalk on Makaimoimo street, resulting in injury. Our office promptly contacted Honolulu 3-1-1 for inspection and repair. The City and County informed us that they repaved the sidewalk on 3/8 and referred the matter to the Department of Planning and Permitting for further review of the root cause.

### Road Safety Requests:

Our office continues to work on various constituent requests received to improve street safety and get drivers to slow down via the installation of traffic calming measures throughout the district.
