

## Legislative Applates

### Bill Updates 🚨

Three of Rep. La Chica's bills have passed both the House and Senate and are now headed to Conference Committee for final deliberations this week! Here's what's moving forward:

- = HB862 Fixing the School Bus Crisis
  - Expands the types of vehicles that can be used to transport students, helping address the statewide bus driver shortage
- HB1231 Safer Routes to School
  - Adds more red light and speed cameras at dangerous intersections and near school zones to protect keiki and families.
- B329 Expanding Childcare & Preschool Access
  - Empowers the School Facilities Authority to develop early learning centers more efficiently across the state.

### Resolution Updates 📢

Three of Rep. La Chica's House resolutions have been adopted! Our office's hope is to push for more transparency and promote public safety. Here's what's been adopted:

- HR107/SCR134 True Cost of School Meals
  - Urges the DOE to provide a detailed report on how much it costs produce school meals to ensure transparency and avoid unnecessary meal price increases
- # HR108/HCR112 Pedestrian First Policy
  - Urges the City Council to adopt a Pedestrian First policy to prioritize pedestrians when making transportation decisions
- 🖁 HR133 Developmental Needs Report
  - Requests the Office of Wellness and Resilience develop a report studying the developmental needs of children born during the COVID-19 pandemic.

## Queen's Medical Center - Wahiawa Updates & QMC - Wahiawa has been open for almost a year and has been successful to providing emergency services to the Wahiawa and nearby communities.

Here's what's been happening:

- Demolition of the long term care building has begun on April 21<sup>st</sup> and will likely finish by early June to make way for more patient care space and a new on-site CT scanner.
- Care has been provided to 18,333 patients since its opening
- **86% of patients** who receive care were treated and returned home the same day

### TWO MEASLES CASES CONFIRMED \*\*



As of April 22, 2025, Hawaii has confirmed two measles cases—one in a young child and the other in the child's adult relative. Both individuals returned from international travel before showing symptoms.

Measles is HIGHLY contagious, especially dangerous for keiki and kupuna, potentially causing pneumonia, brain inflammation, or death. If one person is infected, 9 out of 10 unprotected individuals nearby will catch it.

### Get Protected! Get Injected!

The best protection we have is vaccination. To keep our schools and neighborhoods safe, we need at least 95% immunity coverage to prevent outbreaks through herd immunity. But as you'll see below, some of our schools fall below that threshold - putting everyone at risk.

### Symptoms to Look Out For ••

- · High fever
- Cough
- Runny nose
- Red, watery eyes
- Rash that starts at the hairline, then moves to the face and neck

### How to Understand the Columns:

- RE (%): Religious exemptions students who are not vaccinated due to religious reasons
- INC (%): Incomplete record or students with missing immunization records.

### Take Action:

- Check your child's vaccination status
- Talk to your pediatrician or visit a local clinic
- You can also contact Wahiawā Community Health Center (808) 622-1618 or the Department of Health at (808) 586-8300 to ask about vaccine safety and find out where you get vaccinated.
