### 🚨 CRACKING DOWN ON DANGEROUS DRIVING 🚨

From March-April, I worked closely with Major James Slayter, head of the Honolulu Police Department's Traffic Division, to conduct targeted operations on Meheula Parkway and Kamehameha Highway-in response to serious concerns about speeding, reckless driving, and illegal racing. Although Meheula Parkway isn't typically part of Traffic Division's patrol zone, Major Slayter deployed HPD's Solo Bike and Night Enforcement Units to support local patrols.


### Dear Neighbors,

#### **Investments for Our District**

Your voices helped shape this year's budget. This session, we secured over **\$21 million** in funding for Central Oahu, including:

#### **REP. LA CHICA'S BILLS PASS FINAL READING:**

#### HB862 - SCHOOL BUS OPTIONS

#### Addresses the school bus crisis by allowing motorcoaches, vans, & small buses be used for student transportation.

#### HB1231 - SAFER ROUTES TO SCHOOL



Establishes the largest dedicated funding source for the Safe Routes to School program to support roadway improvements in high-risk areas.

#### HB329 - PRESCHOOL ACCESS & HOUSING



Enables the School Facilities Authority to develop more preschool classrooms statewide - including workforce housing in Mililani.

#### SB1300 - FREE SCHOOL MEALS



While I didn't author this bill, I played a key role in negotiating its passage. Starting next school year, students on reduced-price lunch will receive school meals for free. The next year, the program expands to families earning up to 300% of the federal poverty level.

### **House Education Committee**

The House Education Committee heard over 111 bills and resolutions this session focused on student success, fair teacher pay, expanded access to meals and buses, school facility upgrades, and holding the DOE accountable.
